

Presenters for the 2019 CNH District Missions Conference

Dawit (David) Bokre currently serves as lead pastor of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Hayward, CA. Born and raised in the capital city of Asmara, Eritrea, Dawit and his family were faithful members of the Eritrean Evangelical Lutheran Church. In 2003 at the age of 13, he came to the United States and lived in Boston and Houston during the first five years of his life in America. In 2008, Dawit was called by a small group of Eritrean in the Bay Area to be a bi-vocational church worker and plant an Eritrean Church. After his arrival, the group started to meet in homes and eventually started to meet every Sunday for worship in their heart language, Tigrinya. Also at this time, Dawit began his theological training entering the Ethnic Immigrant Institute of Theology program through Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, MO, which he then completed in 2016. Today, Dawit serves an English-speaking multiethnic group and a Tigrinya-speaking Eritrean group at Good Shepherd while he continues to look for ways to plant more churches. Dawit resides in Hayward, CA with his wife, Saron. Apart from ministry, he enjoys meeting new people, socializing with others in coffee shops, cooking, and watching basketball, football and soccer.



John Denninger (Keynote Speaker) is currently serving his 3rd term as Southeastern District President. He was first elected to the position in May, 2012. Born in Hannibal, Missouri, John spent most of his growing up years in Fort Wayne, IN. He graduated from Concordia Junior College, Ann Arbor, MI; Concordia Senior College, Ft. Wayne, IN; and Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO. He earned his Doctor of Ministry from Fuller Theological Seminary, Pasadena, CA. After being ordained in 1980, he served as Pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church, Auburn, NE. In 1984, he was called to be Campus Pastor at Nebraska University, Kearney, NE, where he served until receiving a call from Prince of Peace, Springfield, VA in 1988. He served at Prince of Peace first as Associate Pastor, and then as Senior Pastor. CNH District's **Disability Ministry Task Force (DMTF)** is using the life and ministry experience of panel members to lead a discussion on ways a congregation can begin to grow a healthy and vital disability ministry. Each panel member serves as their congregation's Disability Ministry Contact Person. Their congregations have found a variety of exciting ways to build an environment of disability awareness and welcoming inclusion of people with disabilities and their families into the life of the congregation.



- ⇒ **Dianne Flynn** – Peace Lutheran Church in Sacramento, CA. She began a disability ministry at Peace Lutheran Church in Sacramento two years ago, where they have held a workshop and respite events.
- ⇒ **Rev. Phillip Kohlmeyer** – Serves part-time at Christ Lutheran, Martinez. They host a weekly dinner followed by Bible study. Some special needs adults of the community have also participated. Rev. Kohlmeyer, who is a member of Faith Lutheran Church in Pleasant Hill, facilitated their first disability awareness workshop in 2018. That congregation opened a preschool on January 2, 2019, which is designed as an inclusive school with plans to enroll some special needs children.
- ⇒ **Art Larson** – Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Los Gatos, CA. Art organizes a four-hour respite event for children with disabilities twice a year at Holy Cross, and has helped create an environment of disability awareness within the congregation.
- ⇒ **Debbie Oatman** – Grace Lutheran Church in Hayward, CA. Along with her husband, Rev. Mark Oatman, they are passionate about ministry to people of all abilities. They lead volunteers of Grace Lutheran Church, Hayward, in providing a twice-monthly worship and dinner fellowship called *Friday Friends* for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- ⇒ **Elaine Zimmerman** – St. John's Lutheran Church in Napa, CA. She served as a teacher in Lutheran schools for 24 years, and this training also led her to provide Bible classes for children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Elaine will serve as the moderator for the discussion.



Engene (Gene) Eckert is a long-time member of Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Los Gatos, CA. He grew up in Racine, WI, and graduated from Lutheran High School there. After graduating from Valparaiso University, he worked as an engineer for GE until retirement. All along, the Lord has kept him busy in high school youth work, singing, handbells, and Mission trips to the Czech Republic, Thailand, Taiwan, and now to his home church community. 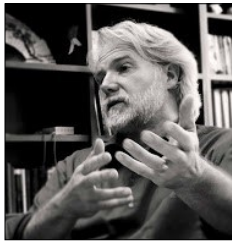
